3	Food & drink:  Make a shopping list.  Get enough food and drink and don't forget to prepare the food.  Get a cool box and put the ice packs in the freezer.  If necessary, clean the barbecue and buy anything you will need for it such as charcoal.  Make sure you have enough water. You will need around 2 to 3 litres per person on a hot day.  Non-alcoholic drinks such as (homemade) lemonade, (homemade) iced tea, fruit juices and soft drinks.

0	Check the weather forecast again just before your garden party starts and make any necessary preparations in case the weather isn't going to be great.
